Elbert Eugene "Gene" Heath, 86, a long-time resident of Anderson, Indiana, passed away on July 8, 2021, due to complications from leukemia. He passed away peacefully with his children by his side.

Gene was born on July 24, 1934, in Cross Plains, Indiana to Harold and Elsie (Haskell) Heath. He married the love of his life, Alice (Wiley) Heath, on November 25, 1956, in Florence, Indiana. They were married for over 62 years until her passing in February 2019. Gene and Alice had three children together who survive him: Terry Heath, of Zephyrhills, Florida, Tamera (Ronald) Veverka, of Brookville, Ohio, and Timothy (Terri) Heath, of Anderson, Indiana.
