He was a movie and game wholesaler and also did flea markets in Indianapolis with movies, games, balloons and wholesaler merchandise. He was into many businesses on the internet; he loved the internet business world. He had a beautiful vacation home on the Ohio River that he built with the help of his nephew,

Daniel. He loved to jet ski, boat, water ski, and anything to do with the river. He had several family reunions at his home on the river. He loved all his extended family and kept up with all of them. He loved to put a "smile" on everyone's face up until the very last. He loved to travel the states and spend time at his condos in Florida. In his younger years, he would go to Florida when laid off from GM and work for his former father-in-law, Gerald "Jerry" Anderson. He gave back to the community in many ways on personal levels to help others and donated to elementary and junior/senior high schools and sponsored many educational things for Anderson Community Schools and the Pendleton School District. He sponsored a Pendleton Junior Baseball Team every year. He loved to give to children.
