



## Basil Burton Dulin

October 28, 1910 - August 3, 2010

Vincennes - Basil Burton Dulin, 99, passed away August 3, 2010 at Colonial Assisted Living in Vincennes, Indiana. Basil Burton Dulin was a radiologist and a gentleman. He was born in Frankfort, Indiana on October 28, 1910 to Harley B. and Mabel Ryan Dulin. His wife of 54 years, Julia Guess Dulin, passed away April 24, 2000. Dr. Dulin graduated from Indiana University and received his medical degree from Indiana University School of Medicine in 1940. He entered World War II as a medical officer and was with the first troops to engage the Japanese in the Philippines. He was captured in 1941 and remained a POW in the Philippines until the end of the war. He was a survivor of Bataan and several Japanese concentration camps. He was a decorated officer and received the bronze star. He retired in 1978 from St. John's Hospital with 28 years of service as a radiologist. He was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Anderson; Mt. Moriah Masonic Lodge #77 F. & A.M.; Scottish Rite Valley of Indianapolis; was a member and Past President of the Madison County Medical Society; and the Defenders of Bataan and Corrigidor. His daughter, Julia and husband, Dave Andrews reside in Key Largo, Florida. His son, Michael and wife, Kathy reside in Vincennes, Indiana with his grandchildren, Benjamin and Max. Two sisters, Agnes and Doris, and two brothers, John and Victor preceded him in death. Visitation will be from 11-1:00 PM on Saturday, August 7, 2010 at Robert D. Loose Funeral Home; 200 W. 53rd Street; Anderson. Services will be Saturday, August 7, 2010 at 1:00 PM, at the funeral home, with Pastor Ryan Rasmussen of the First
