Green Valley, Arizona - Billy J. Nagel, 83, Green Valley, died February 28, 2005 at his residence after an extended illness. He was born February 1, 1922 in Elwood, Indiana, and resided in Green Valley, Arizona. He lived in this area most of his life, moving to Arizona after retirement. He retired in 1980 from the US Postal Service in Anderson and Tucson, Arizona after 38 years of service. He was the Supervisor of Window Service at the Anderson Post Office. He was a graduate of Elwood High School in 1940. He was a 2nd Lieutenant in the Indiana State Guard during WWII. He was a member of the Community Methodist Church in Green Valley, Arizona where he served as an usher since 1992. He was a 50 year Mason and was a charter member of Adobe Masonic Lodge in Tucson, Arizona. He helped form and was a 10 year member of Richland Township Fire Department and was one of it's first chiefs. After retiring to Green Valley, he served for 2 years as a volunteer at Green Valley Recreation. He is survived by his wife whom he married November 25, 1955: Dorothy Allman Nagel.
