We were fortunate to have him with us as long as we did. He struggled with his health issues for many years, always presenting the best person he could muster. He was well known among the health care community for his positive attitude and willingness to encourage other patients during their trying times. Those that know him would say that would be exactly how he tried to be for everyone.

David spent his career as an educator, receiving his Bachelors and Masters degrees from Ball State with advanced certifications from Purdue. His teaching career began in 1972, in Brookeville, Indiana. He then taught in the Noblesville school system at Stony Creek, North, Hinkle Creek, and Noble Crossing. He spent his later years with the Gifted program, a role he relished and in which he excelled. Many have described David as "their favorite teacher," a well deserved and most cherished title.

He loved to help people outside of work. He spoke often of his time working on the Suicide Prevention Lifeline on one extreme and counseling Miss America candidates on their interview questions on the other.

He was also an avid collector of pottery, art, music and books. His appreciation and recollection of the expression and investment each item represented was remarkable.

Sadly, David didn't get to enjoy the Christmas season this year. To say he loved the holiday would be a massive understatement.
