



## Delores Belva Vogel

February 18, 1936 - January 14, 2006

Anderson - Delores Belva Segner Vogel of Anderson, died peacefully January 14, 2006, after a courageous four-year battle with ovarian cancer, at the age of 69. To her children, Mom was a God-loving, brave, fun-loving thankful and intelligent woman. She knew no stranger.
