Everett Muterspaugh, 83, of Pendleton, passed away on November 5, 2022, after a long illness surrounded by his family.

He was born on March 8, 1939, in Middletown, to Ruth (Gibbons) and Thomas Muterspaugh.

Everett graduated from Anderson High School in 1957. He attended Ball State University before deciding to join the workforce full-time.

Everett was the epitome of a good man. He was devoted to his family, work, and principles of doing what was honest and right every minute of his life.

He spent his entire work life at Pay Less Super Markets while it was still privately owned by the Contos family. Bud Contos hired him at the age of 14 to sell Christmas trees in the parking lot. He was the very first male cashier and was a store manager by the age of 24. He loved the grocery business and his Pay Less family.
