



## Forest Cecil Johnson

August 26, 1919 - January 17, 2007

Anderson - Forest Cecil Johnson, 87, Anderson, died January 17, 2007 at Countryside Manor, Anderson after being there since June 2006. He was born August 26, 1919 in Orestes, Indiana, the son of Louis W. and Florence Kirkwood Johnson. Forest graduated from Summitville High School in 1938. He joined the US Navy in June of 1942 and was a Pharmacist's Mate First Class on a troop transport in the Northwest Pacific. He was honorably discharged in 1945. He lived in the Summitville-Anderson area most of his life. Forest retired as a utility man in Plant 3 of Delco Remy Division of General Motors on September 1, 1976 after 34 1/2 years. He was a member of Eastview Church of the Nazarene. He is survived by his wife whom he married May 19, 1950, Jeanne Martz Johnson; daughter, Debbie Dan Taylor of Anderson; son, Michael Debi Johnson of Warren; son, Donald L. Rowden of Galveston; grandchildren, Christina Smith, Brenda Rodney Grubb and Regina George Dillman; eight step-great grandchildren; one great great grandchild; a sisters-in-law, Lula Johnson and Mary Hittson; and several nieces and nephews.
