Pendleton - Frieda Arlene Clark Teagardin, 99, Pendleton, died June 15, 2011 at Rawlins House, Pendleton. She was born September 5, 1911 in Pendleton, and lived most of her life in Madison County. She was a 1929 graduate of Pendleton High School. She was Executive Secretary at Pendleton High School for many years and at Community Hospital in Anderson where she was bookkeeper for the hospital drive and later secretary to the administrator for seven years. She was a member of First United Methodist Church, past president of Sigma Phi Gamma Sorority and Saturday Club in Pendleton. She was also a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution.
