



Rev. Glenn Eugene Skinner

April 28, 1931 - February 1, 2025

Glenn E. Skinner, 93, of Anderson, passed away on February 1, 2025, while at home in the presence of loving family and friends. He was under the care of Hospice, giving gentle care until his meeting with the Lord. (A thank you to his special nurse, "Jo" Ann).

Glenn was born in Yorktown, Indiana, moving early to Anderson where he grew up under the loving care of his parents, George and Artie Belle (Van-meter) Skinner, who preceded him in death. Glenn was the twelfth of thirteen siblings, who have all become a part of Heaven.

Rev. Skinner graduated from Pendleton High School, class of 1949, where he was known as a speed runner on the Pendleton Track team.

After graduation, Glenn was hired as a car inspector for the Central Indiana Railroad Company, where he soon lost a leg due to the negligence of an engineer. However, this never dampened his spirits nor kept him from giving full-time ministry for God. He studied Bible at Anderson College, now Anderson University. Rev. Glenn pastored forty years for the Lord in many capacities. He first pastored under the leadership of his father, Rev. George, at the Jackson Park Church of God, later becoming Main Street Church of God where he served until his retirement in 1996.

Glenn is survived by his wife and soulmate, Judy, and a daughter, Glenda. He is now being greeted by a son, Glenn Max, who became a member of Heaven eight years earlier. Glenn was the grandfather to five grandchildren, thirteen great-grandchildren, many nieces and nephews, and a very special, "Best Friend/nephew, Bruce Krieg.

A memorial and remembrance service will be held at Main Street Church of God on Saturday, February 22, 2025, at 2:00 pm with visitation one hour prior. Rev. John Kinser and Pastor Carl Stagner will be officiating. Former associates of Rev. Skinner, Rev. Tim Warrum, and Rev. Steve Williams will also be sharing special thoughts about their beloved pastor. Open-door sharing will be offered during the memorial.

Glenn served God with his whole heart, soul, and mind. He walked with Him daily.

He will be greatly missed.
