Glenn R. Smith, 73, of Anderson, passed away on April 21, 2016 at Community Hospital after a two year battle with a Meningioma Brain Tumor. He was born on April 10, 1943, to Ethel (Tower) Smith and William Arthur Smith.

Glenn graduated from Madison Heights High School in 1962. He served six years in the Army National Guard, and was honorably discharged as a sergeant in 1970. He was a 1999 retiree of Delco Remy and Magnequench International.
