Gregory Wyant Williams, 79, of Anderson, passed away on January 15, 2024. He was born on December 22, 1944, in Anderson, Indiana and resided in Anderson for 41 yrs before heading to the sunshine of Southern California in 1985.

Gregory graduated from Pendleton High School in 1963.

He was employed by General Motors-Delco Remy Division in Anderson before opening Greg Williams Auto Body in 1976. Greg was known for his custom cars, custom body & paint work. He closed the Body Shop in 1985. While living in Whittier, CA, Greg worked with Legendary Dean Moon, Moon Equipment Co., while continuing to turn out custom body and paint work for clients and Film Studios.
