One day out of curiosity, I asked you why you never ate her food. You explained, "she lives on the street, she doesn't have a refrigerator, it could make us sick." When I think back about the different containers the woman carried the food in, I'm pretty sure it was food she had found here and there around the streets of Anderson. You treated that woman with respect and dignity. You treated her like a lady, a friend, or a coworker. She needed someone in this world to praise her and treat her like a human being and you did just that! To this day I'm a firm believer in treating everyone equally with respect and dignity, no matter their situation. Thank you so much for teaching me this!

I have grown into a 43 year old successful woman, that wishes she could wrap her arms around you, go shoe shopping with you, take a drive in the country looking at barns with you, one last time! I want to tell you thank you for everything you did for my brother, Layne

and I. We had a single mom that tried to raise us. You were the best helper anyone could ever ask for!
