Howard H. Kardatzke, 78, of Alexandria, passed away February 1, 2016 at his residence in Alexandria, IN. He was born on April 12, 1937 to Dr. Carl and Eva Clare Kardatzke in Anderson, Indiana.

Howard graduated from Anderson High School, Anderson University, Indiana University, and Michigan State where he received his doctorate.

He was a retired educator and a professor at Ball State University and Anderson University. Howard also spent 25 years as director of Teacher Certification for the state of West Virginia. He was active in his Charleston WV church where he served many roles. Above all, he was an intelligent, gentle, kind man of faith who loved his family and friends dearly.

Howard loved traveling and relished experiencing new cultures. This love began when his father moved the family to Kenya for a year. Howard loved Kenya and this country's people. He prided in sailing on the Queen Mary at the same time as Winston Churchill was travelling, and he had the opportunity to hear him speak.

Howard was humorous, a jokester and famous for changing the rules of family games to his advantage. He was a word master, a singer, a craftsman. Though education was his life, he always enjoyed working with his hands.

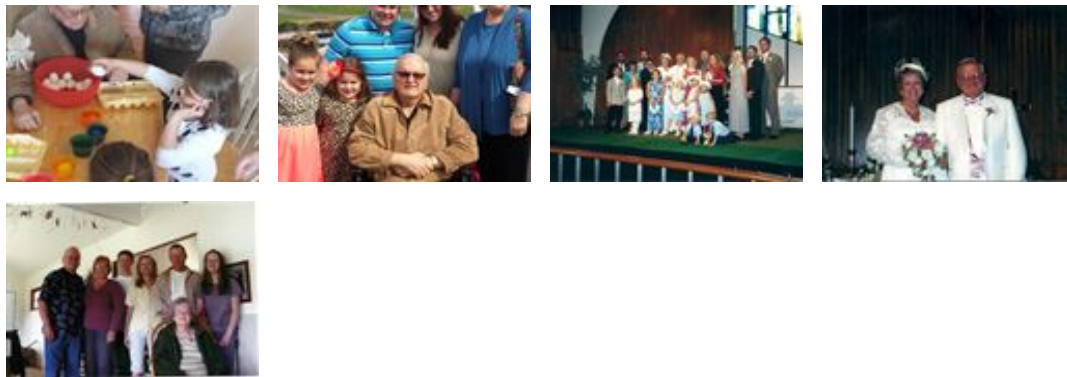
