Anderson - Hubert Charles Priser, 83, Anderson, died October 16, 2002 at Manor Care, Anderson after an extended illness. He was born September 20, 1919 in Anderson, Indiana, and resided in Anderson, Indiana. He lived in this area all his life. He was employed at the Guide Lamp Division of General Motors in tool engineering until his retirement after 38.2 years of service. He graduated from Anderson High School in 1938. He served in combat with the U.S. Army during World War II in the 613th field Artillery, Mars Task Force in China and Burma, and helped open the Burma Road. He is now an honorable veteran of that war where he received a Bronze Star, Asian Pacific Ribbon with 4 Battle Stars, American Theater Ribbon, China Service Ribbon and a Special Operation Medal presented by General Chiang Kai-Shek of China. He was a 50 year member of Mount Moriah Masonic Lodge #77 F. & A.M.; Scottish Rite Valley of Indianapolis and the Murat Temple Shrine. He was a Kentucky Colonel, a Past Commander of the Madison County Shrine Desert Patrol and Past Commander of the Legion of Honor. He is survived by his Three Children: Linda & husband Jeff Richards of Sharpsville. Stephen & wife Diana Priser of Anderson. Anita Priser of Indianapolis.
