He was almost always to be found sporting a Nascar hat, riding around on his motorized wheelchair, visiting friends at the Daily Grind, Flashback, the Toast, the Eagles Lodge, Golden House or the White River Apartments where he resided. His humorous sarcasm, appreciation for life and strength to fight the odds are an inspiration to all who knew him. He will be missed, but not forgotten. He is survived by his son, David Isabelle & David Swartz of Anderson; a daughter, Rebecca Isabelle of Schenectady, New York; many brothers and sisters in Canada; several nieces and nephews; and his many special friends at White River Apartments and Excel. He was preceded in death by his wife whom he married in New York City, New York, Evelyn Gunnerman Isabelle on January 11, 1986. Services will be Saturday, February
