



## Jesse Monday

October 30, 1930 - December 20, 2013

Jesse Hansel Monday, was killed in an auto accident on December 20th while he was traveling from Liberty, KY to Indianapolis to celebrate Christmas with his sons and their families. He was born on October 31, 1930 in Liberty, Kentucky. Jesse married Betty Carrier on October 11, 1952 and shortly thereafter moved to Anderson, IN to work for Delco-Remy. He resided most of his life in Anderson but had moved back to Liberty, KY after the death of his wife in 2010. He retired from Delco Remy in 1983 after 30 years of service. He also farmed, built houses and enjoyed restoring old cars. After his retirement he could be found delivering flowers for his wife's business, helping out at his son's business or spending time with his grandson. He was a member of New Hope Trinity Church in Anderson. He loved racing, especially NASCAR. Jesse is survived by his son and daughter-in-law, Terry and Lacinda Monday of Indianapolis; son, Tony Monday of Indianapolis, grandson, Kyle Monday of Liberty, KY, and great-granddaughter, Jesse Monday of Liberty, KY, brother, Verlin Dee Monday of Anderson, IN and brother, Herlin Monday of Liberty, KY.
