Pendleton - John "Jack" Moore, 79, Pendleton, passed away June 16, 2010 at Community Hospital, Anderson after a sudden illness. He was born November 3, 1930 in Cincinnati, Ohio, and resided in Madison County most of his life. Jack was a 1949 graduate of Anderson High School. He served his country in the US Army during the Korean Conflict. He retired in 1988 from Delco Remy Division of General Motors after 34 years of service.
