Alexandria - Keumars "Q" Ahdieh, 70, Alexandria, passed away April 2, 2011 at Bethany Pointe Health Campus-Anderson. He was born October 18, 1940 in Tehran, Iran, and resided in Alexandria. He lived in the Muncie area for over 35 years. Q was a fourth generation member of the Baha'i Faith and a member of the Muncie Baha'i Community for many years.
