October 25, 1923 - December 31, 2006

Punta Gorda, Florida - Madonna Sutter Kelly, 83, Punta Gorda, died December 31, 2006 at Charlotte Regional Medical Center-Punta Gorda, Florida after after fighting an illness for several months. She was born October 25, 1923 in Effingham County, Illinois to Reuben and Susie Birch Sutter. She graduated from Altamont High School, Altamont, Illinois in 1941 and Midland Business Institute in St. Louis, Missouri in 1942. She then moved to Anderson for employment with the Gospel Trumpet Company later Warner Press as an executive secretary for 42 years retiring in December 1984.
