



## Mary Siktberg

November 21, 1923 - April 4, 2020

Mary C. Siktberg, 96, passed away on Saturday, April 4, 2020 at Community Hospital in Anderson, Indiana.

Mary was born on November 21, 1923 in Miami County, Indiana, the daughter of Theo Cagley and Minnie (Cagley) Draper. She graduated from Clay Township Miami County High School in 1941 and graduated from Indiana Business College. She worked at the United States Air Force Base as secretary to Mr. Stone of Stone Construction Company (Grissom Air Force Base). She also attended Indiana University.

She was an active member of the Anderson Christian & Missionary Alliance Church, West Cross Street Alliance Church, where she taught Sunday School Class, marriage and parenting classes, and active in every part of the church ministry.
