“ Dear Sandra and Family, we are very saddened to hear about Neil passing. Neil was a very good person and I always enjoyed his company. For 18-20 years in the 1940s and 1950s Neil, his family, and our family The Law's, 5 boys and 1 girl lived as neighboring farm families about a quarter mile apart. Life was so much simpler then. We rode the school bus everyday from September to May. In addition to our daily chores of caring for our small dairy herd and small flock of chicken and pigs, Neil was seriously indulged in reading and various intellectual activities. He had little interest in participating in sports or hunting. Neil's mother Hollis was a lovely lady, who I think had a lot to do with Neil's interest in the intellectual aspects of life. Both of our families attended separate churches every Sunday, had family dinners, and attended Roanoke school and village activities, Saturday night town gatherings, free outdoor movies, and the Fall Festival. Neil was the oldest of the Eisenhut siblings. Judy was about a year younger, and Steve came along several years later. Neil attended Purdue University after graduating, I'm sure with honors, from Roanoke High School. In approximately 1961, Neil graduated from Purdue University with a B.S. in Electrical Engineering. I had little to no contact with Neil after high school, until about 2004. Since that time we have visited each other once a year at our residence in Taveres, Florida.
