He met Kathryn Parker in 1980, they married on May 30, 1981 He retired from the Special Investigation Branch of the Royal Military Police. He moved to the United States with his family, in 1994 to Anderson, Indiana. He then began work at the Board of Pensions of the Church of God as the Director of Financial Advisory and Education. He served with the Prison Ministry and the Friendship Ministry at East Side Church of God. He also coached Anderson University Rugby Team. He was a loving husband, father, and friend. He is survived by his wife of 28 years, Kathryn Parker; son, Jacob Parker; daughter, Elizabeth Parker; mother-in-law, Janet Schelton; mother, Lillie Parker, brother, John Parker & wife Janice; and nephews, James and Graham Parker.
