



## Norman Francis McKain

May 2, 1925 - April 12, 2020

Norman Francis McKain, 94, of Anderson, passed away on April 12, 2020 at Bethany Pointe Health Campus due to COVID-19 to join the Lord and his wife Maxine. He was born on May 2, 1925 in Anderson, where he resided most of his life.

He was drafted to the Navy his senior year, served as a HAM radio operator and traveled to many far off places during World War II.

After returning home, on December 28, 1946, he married H. Maxine Bennett-Hanshaw-McKain, and worked at Delco Remy for 38 years as an electrician in the foundry.

He was a faithful servant of the Lord at Goodwin Memorial Nazarene Church, now The New Life Nazarene Church. He kept the air and heat flowing and served as an usher and in several other roles at the church, the Lord was always #1. On the side he served on the Civil Defense Department. He still had a HAM radio and communicated with the SkyLab Astronauts.

Norman is survived by his son, Gary McKain; daughter-in-law, Dianna Hanshaw; several grandchildren, great-grandchildren, great-great-grandchildren, nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by wife, H. Maxine McKain on April 18, 2000; sons, Jim Hanshew, Jack Hanshew; mother, Geraldine McKain; father, Jesse McKain; brothers, Russell McKain and Keith McKain; and his daughter-in-law, Janet McKain.

Private graveside services will take place, with a public celebration of life held at a later date.
