



Pearl Vernetta Clark

September 29, 1923 - November 23, 2013

Pearl Vernetta Clark, 90, of Anderson, passed away on November 23, 2013 at the Saint Vincent Anderson Regional Hospital Anderson, IN. She was born on September 29, 1923 near Fairfield, Illinois. Her parents, Fred and Emma Lee Windlan, moved to Anderson with their children when Pearl was three months old. She lived in Anderson most of her life. Pearl graduated from Anderson High School in 1941; attended Anderson College and graduated from Ball State Teachers College in 1945. She taught in Berne, Anderson, New Castle, Cowan schools and retired from South Madison Schools in 1985. She was the first president of Madison County Association for Retarded Citizens in 1964. She served on the board for six years. She learned to swim at the YWCA and swam there for 29 years. After retirement, she received a certificate for swimming 500 miles--1/2 mile at a session. Pearl was the editor of Lives n' Rhymes, a poetry bi-monthly publication from 1989-2000. She continued to contribute poetry to "Bells Letters". She attended Glad Tidings Assembly of God, Bethany Baptist Church, Victory Baptist Church, and had been a member of First Baptist Church for most of her life. Pearl is survived by her son, Dane Evan Tracy Clark; granddaughters, Emily Clark, Taylor Ross Cleveland, and Abigail Rose Clark; nieces, Mary & Steven Sell, Barbara Showalter and Lori Brad Buck; nephews, Dan and Gary Sumner and many great nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her daughter, Nancy Jo Clark; mother, Emma Lee Windlan; father, Fred Windlan; siblings, Opal Summer, Naomi Smith, James Estace, Fred Evan and Robert Kellis
