Phyllis Loriane Urban, 95, of Anderson, passed away on July 4th at Primrose in Anderson. She was born on August 15, 1918 in Chicago, Illinois and resided most of her life in Anderson.

She worked as a Registrar for Southside Jr. High School.

She was a member of the First Presbyterian Church. After living in Anderson for eight years she met and married William Harter Urban. This period of her life was involving herself in organizational pursuits. She served on the committee to establish the Woman's League of the Fine Arts Center, now known as the Anderson Center for the Arts. She was president and national historian for the Anderson Chapter of the National Society of the Arts and Letters. She was on board of directors for Minnetrista located in Muncie. She and her husband were members of the World Problems Group, meeting for dinner once a month for discussions of worlds problems. She also was liaison officer for Anderson Chapter of the Clowes Hall Women's League of Indianapolis.
