August 2, 1929 - January 31, 2009

Anderson - Ralph L. Corbin, 79, Anderson, died January 31, 2009 at his residence after an extended illness. He was born August 2, 1929 in Lafayette, Indiana, and resided in Anderson. Ralph was a graduate of Jefferson High School and a graduate of Purdue University School of Engineering. After college graduation, he served his country in the US Army during the Korean War as a First Lieutenant. He was a platoon leader and forward observer with a mortar battalion. He began his career with Delco Remy Division of General Motors as a Metallurgical Engineer in 1951, and after his return from military service worked for 36 years, retiring as Manager of Battery Engineering and Development. Ralph was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Anderson where he served as Deacon, Trestee and Elder. He was a member of Tau Beta Pi Engineering Honorary and a member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity. He also served as a Commissioner with the local Boy Scouts of America Council and was an Eagle Scout. He is survived by his wife Dolores Dobbins Corbin whom he married in 1951; three children, Lesley & husband Thomas Devine of Muncie, Thomas & wife Paula Corbin of Irvine, California and Stuart Corbin of Anderson; five grandchildren, Adrienne & husband John Lutz of Austin, Texas, Lauren Devine of Fishers, Page Devine of Muncie, Adam Corbin and Andrea Corbin of Irvine, California; a great grandchild, John Thomas Lutz of Austin, TX and brother, Robert Corbin of Everett, Washington.
