



Rev. Gladis Strohme

October 14, 1914 - June 6, 2006

Anderson - Rev. Gladis Strohme, 91, Anderson, died June 6, 2006 at her residence after a brief illness. She was born October 14, 1914 in New Carlyle, Ohio, and resided in Anderson, Indiana. She was raised by her aunt, Caroline & husband Fred Shipley and lived in this area for almost 30 years. She was always ministering, and just 5 weeks ago, taught three seminary classes. She was a minister of the United Metaphysical Churches headquartered in Roanoke, Virginia. Rev. Strohme served as Staff Medium for the Indiana Association of Spiritualist Camp Chesterfield for more than 20 years and was a member of their Executive Board for 17 years. She was ordained by the Universal Spiritualist Association in 1959, served on its Executive Board for 32 years, and taught in its institute for 30 years, resigning in 1992. Gladis has traveled extensively serving churches throughout the United States with her extraordinary gifts. She served the UMC Association for the past 10 years and served as trustee on their National Board for 8 years. She went to Europe to visit Stonehenge for her 90th birthday. She is survived by her Foster Daughter: Letha Brogdon. Grandsons: Joe Brogdon & fiancée Michelle Robertson and Jon & wife LeAnn Brogdon. Close Friends: Rev.
