September 7, 1921 - March 10, 2007

Anderson - Dr. Richard N. Land, 85, Anderson, died March 10, 2007 at his residence after an extended illness. He was born September 7, 1921 in Richmond, and resided in Anderson since 1960. Dr. Richard Land was a retired Anderson Radiologist. He served as head of the Radiology Department at Community Hospital from 1960 to 1985. He maintained a private practice in the St. John's Medical Arts Building for many years before retiring in 1987. He was a graduate of Richmond High School in 1939. He attended Indiana University, earning an MD degree in 1944. He served in the US Army Air Force in Alaska during WW II, attaining the rank of Captain. He was stationed at Elmendorf Field in Anchorage, Alaska, Ft. Richardson, in Fairbanks, Alaska and Great Falls, Montana, before receiving an honorable discharge on October 3, 1947. Dr. Land was a member of the American Medical Association, Indiana and Madison County Medical Associations, and the Anderson and Edgewood Country Clubs. He was a avid golfer and a life long fan of the Chicago Cubs. He is survived by his Nephews: Rick Barbara Fulmer of Florida, and Fred Ingrid Fulmer of Florida. He was preceded in death by his parents: Horatio and Thelma Schillinger Land, Wife: Virginia Stoddard Land, a son, Stephen Land and a sister, Almira Sue Fulmer. Services will be Wednesday, March 14, 2007 at 1:00pm, at Anderson Memorial Park, Chapel, with Rev. Joe Huff officiating. Burial will be in Memorial Park Cemetery, Anderson.
