Robert Woschitz, 90, of Anderson, passed away on November 25, 2022. He was born on May 2, 1932 in Gary, Indiana and resided in Anderson for most of his life.

Robert graduated with honors from the University of Michigan's Engineering School, receiving two degrees. Also, he was a pitcher on Michigan's 1953 College Baseball World Series Championship team. After college, he served his country in the United States Army.

He enjoyed a long, 40 year career at General Motors, primarily employed by the Guide Lamp Division in Anderson. He started at GM as an engineer, spent many years as an internal Midwest Engineering Sales Liaison, and finally retired in 1992 after serving as Guide Lamp's Quality Assurance Manager. He was passionate about designing and building automobiles.

He was a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather, and uncle. He and his family were

members of the Anderson Country Club where they enjoyed making many dear friends and participating in club dances, golf tournaments, and other activities.

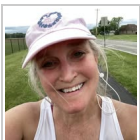

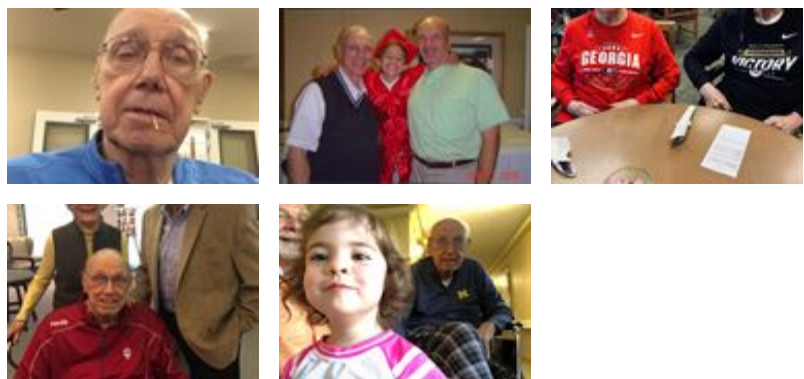
