Cremation will take place and no services will be held per Sandra's wishes.

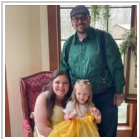

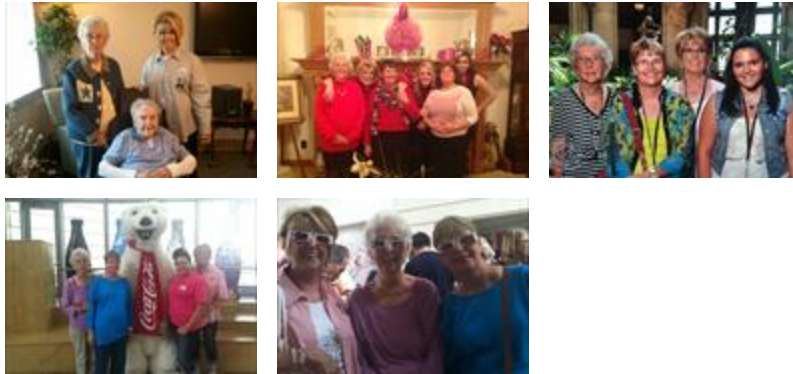
