Anderson - Stephen R. Nemyer, 62, Anderson, died April 12, 2010 at Community Hospital, after a brief illness. He was born May 11, 1947 in Anderson, and was a lifelong resident. Steve retired from the United States Army, where he served as Sgt. Major during the Vietnam War, earning two purple hearts. He was a member of V.F.W. Post #266 and the Redman's Lodge. Survivors include his wife, whom he married June, 29, 1992, Barbara Murdock Nemyer; daughter, Bonnie Jason Wolfe of Brownsburg and Stephanie Nemyer of Anderson; stepchildren, James Bevel of Celina, Chris Bevel & Brian Bevel of Anderson, Jennifer Bevel of Columbus, OH, Samantha Goodson of Hermitage, TN, Jerry Byrd of Oklahoma and Teresa Brent Patterson of Indianapolis; grandchildren, Craig & Kendall Wolfe, Brian L. Bevel, Cheyenne Rogers, Isabella Bevel, Cameron & Alyssa Byrd, and Jacob & Luke Patterson; siblings; Joyce Moore, David Nemyer, Madonna Patterson, Dorothy Thompson, Terri Partain, Lisa Riddle, Marcia Thompson, Mark Nemyer and Nancy Knotts. He was preceded in death by his parents, Willis R. & Beatrice Critser Nemyer; and first wife, Emma Ferguson Nemyer in 1992. .... you at first sight. You raised them as your own and then added quickly another child to your home, me (Bonnie in Sept 1966). You were unable to actually marry Emma until April of 1967 due to your military action and also unable to see your first biological child until 6 months after birth. However, you kept serving your country and returned home to your ready-made family which you moved to the Anderson area.

Growing up we had lots of adventures and weekends at Grandma and Grandpa Fergusons to play baseball and lawn darts with the cousins. We spent time in Daleville at Grandma and Grandpa Nemyers' with my Aunts and Uncles, who I thought were cousins at the time. We had fun outside fishing, walking to culverts, playing with snakes, looking for mushrooms, and pawpaws in the solitude of the Fergie woods. I remember you and the Uncles hiding on Grandma Fergie's rooftop when the visitors came to see us that you didn't quite enjoy.

We had bats in the house on Pitt Street only to be shot with a gun and splattered in Jerry's bedroom. We had a honeysuckle bush the kids set on fire playing house. We had that lady down the street who wandered the field and you saved us from her, she was a little "psycho." Also, you saved us from the "grey house witch" or older lady in my youth that was a recluse who had her pet's tombstones in her backyard. We were frightened and you calmed our fears. You saved Teresa from the weird man that blocked her in his drive way on her bike. We were young, naive and your children; and you were our Dad-- our hero.

You were blessed with the first of your grandchildren in 1985 and after. Cameron started that trail of many grandchild blessings which included Jacob, Alyssa, Luke, Kendall, and Craig. You loved every one of them and took them into your heart. Mom (Emma) passed away after battling with primary liver cancer in 1992.

You "pulled up your boot straps" and surrounded yourself with another love and family. You married Barb Murdock Nemyer on June 29, 1992. Immediately, you had more step-children which you loved. The more the merrier for you.

May 10, 1993 you were blessed with another "sparkle in your eye"; a birthday present for you- Stephanie Nemyer named after you. She was destined to be with you and Barb to maintain your family, love and energy. You remained and formed your life on Pitt Street and continued serving in the VFW Honor Guard, the VFW and also spoke at Stephanie's school about Veterans' on many occasions.

Recently, you have been blessed with a number of great-grandchildren who have extended your family.

Your health deteriorated gradually over the last three years as God deemed you had served him well. You captured the hearts, love and friendship of many nieces, nephews, aunts, uncles and comrades along your way. You are the American Family Hero. Dad- as Jody Walker said well, "the Taps this time are for you."

I will dearly miss our long chats weekly and I will have you always in my heart. I love you with all my heart and soul. You did well Dad! Enjoy the walk with the LORD and I will see you soon. You put the "S" in Stamina, service; you put the "T" in tough, you put the "E" in emergent actions or "do it now attitude"; "V" in vast experience and diverse life experience and love; and "E" for everlasting servant life and excellent Dad.

“ *Personal Tribute to my Dad (Steve)*

Dad-

You are now with our LORD and with Mom, Emma, in Heaven. There is no question in my mind that you were and still are one of the greatest servant leaders ever. You were private and always kept us guessing. And though we were, puzzled from time to time, you had given me all of the information I would ever need to succeed.

It was not until these past few weeks that the pieces began to snap together.

Your persistence and toughness are second to none. Your service to your family, to your friends, to your comrades and to your country are evident. Your body and your soul were instruments of a great man...a great soldier. You are an example of a great man and Dad! You are the ultimate "servant for the LORD." Many do not understand your stamina, your drive, your push to help others even at a pace that you leave the shell of your body in "havoc, pain and great use".

You were always the first to help others, sometimes even before helping your immediate family. It was because you had taught us the ultimate teaching of the LORD, and the need to "pull up their bootstraps" and forge ahead. To be good soldiers and to fortify our lives with His blessings and servant leadership...to build our lives around the LORD, the military, community and love.

It took me years to understand your comprehension of leadership or service. The fact that in the "Blizzard of 78" you made sure Grandpa Nemyer was taken care of during his illness, provided transportation alongside the National Guard, and helped people to get their medications and groceries. This is one small example of my youth that resounds. At that time, I was 11 and did not understand why

you did not stay home to be with me and to play in that "blizzard snow" or why you did not go to get us bread and milk when you did it for so many others; but today, I understand your service attitude and global community efforts. It takes maturity and selfless thinking to do these seemingly small tasks which are, in reality, enormous feats which you've accomplished, though many of us still struggle to even understand or appreciate them.

Your life started on May 11, 1947, born to Beatrice Critser Nemyer and Willis Ray Nemyer (the first of ten children who were eventually referenced by number rather than name). You were small, yet mighty and at less than two lbs, you were placed in a make-shift shoe box bed and put in a dresser bureau. At three years old you were upstairs on the second floor of a building and the center of an infamous article in the Anderson Herald about falling out of a window and getting a cracked skull. You started out in this world small, mighty and with a toughness that was unprecedented. You and your family had little monetary value, and you asked for very little.

You were a little ornery and loved the outdoors and fishing as well. You were ambitious to do something and anxious to be out of the small abode on 42nd Street. At 15, you moved out of your home and moved in with your Grandma Rainer for a short time. You told me you also joined the circus when you were very young. I am not sure today if this is true or if you lived in a circus of 10 kids or if you really did go there. None of these situations would surprise me in the least.

At 16, your goal was to join the Army and lied about your age to serve your country and military. By age 17 you were enlisted in the Army. You then were trained and were part of the Big Red 1 Cavalry (Infantry Division) and fought combat in Vietnam. You had a great friend in Vietnam, your monkey Charlie, that kept you company in the infantry. He left you barreling out of your weapon as you fired at the enemy. Poor Charlie. You were a POW as well in Vietnam and the scars of war remained with you throughout the rest of your adult

and family life. During this time you courted and married Emma Ferguson who was the proud mother of a baby girl, Teresa and a 4 year old boy, Jerry who both adored
