Susan also got to experience a night in the dorm with Brenda & I. She slept on the floor in a sleeping bag. All was well until the fire alarm rang in the wee hours! Oh the sight of her trying to get out of that sleeping bag!

During the blizzard of '78 we shared a 3 room apt in a house on McKinley while at BSU. We were low on groceries & was going to walk to the pantry when a bread truck comes down the road. We flagged him down, Susan gets in the truck & heads to the pantry with a total stranger driving a bread truck!

While a MHHS we discovered that one could get from the old library downtown to Harmeson Dr by way of Frischs on Broadway (in her dad's big old Buick)- who knew!

Christmas 2013 I could never have gotten through that day without Susan. Dad & I would have been lost without her & Jeff joining us for dinner. I probably didn't thank her enough while she was here, but I'll never forget how she made a really sad day into one I'll always cherish.

Junior high, high school, Ball State to RNs at Ball Memorial to retired old friends. What laughter & joy she brought with her the day she knocked on the door in July 1967.
