“Frosty and my Dad, David Atkinson, were great friends since high school. I always will remember him since I was little and learned my Dad had a friend everyone called Frosty ---I always though that was so bad ass.

I never thought that almost four years after Frosty passed I would lose my own Dad on March 2, 2014 to cancer. The only comfort I can take is that I know Frosty and my Dad are somewhere jammin' out to some music together!

I remember my Dad got a copy from Frosty of Robbie Robertson's solo album. One of my best memories of being a 7 year old was my Dad playing that album and I loved all the tracks on it.

The first track, Fallen Angel, was always my favorite and it has always reminded me of my Dad and my childhood. As I grew into a young adult, I knew I wanted to play this song at my Dad's funeral when that day might come.

The last day of Dad's life, when we knew it was near the end, I played this song from the other room. I did it for me and my Dad. My Mom said as it started he instantly relaxed and wasn't agitated anymore. I think he knew it was time to go.

It wasn't too long after that when I heard my Mom's moans of pain. I knew what it meant, that my Dad was gone. I was honored I got to play the song for him while he had his last thoughts of his family and friends and took his last breath.

I indeed played it at his funeral two days later as I had always wanted, although I had never thought I would play it for him as he was dying. Something told me to go and put the song on for him.
