Anderson - Warren H. Brown, 84, Anderson, died December 24, 2005 at St. Johns Health System, Anderson Indiana after an extended illness. He was born March 6, 1921 in Brooklyn, New York, and resided in Anderson, Indiana for the last 15 years and Pendleton since 1945.
